The ordinary morning of 4 February, 2023 was converted into a supernal one when Pt. Gaurav Mazumdar left the audience mesmerised by his *sitar vadan*. He was accompanied by Mr. Abhishek Mishra on *tabla*.



The second segment of the day had a lot to offer. It gave the audience an opportunity to be part of an enriching talk by Mr Jaswant Singh Zafar, a writer and a multi-faceted poet based at Ludhiana, Punjab. He recited few of his poems which enticed the audience. Every word he spoke was just a unique experience.

Classic Cinema Screening is an integral part of SPICMACAY for movies that have been considered as the mirror held out to the face of the society. Keeping this in mind, screening of the movie 'Modern Times by Charlie Chaplin' was done.

Conceptual sessions by SPICMACAY volunteers, Tabla, Calligraphy, Bharatanatyam, Nattuvangam workshops kept everyone intrigued. In the intensives, the experience was both intense and inspiring.

The luminaries of music that set the stage alight with their scintillating performance in the evening were Vidushi Ragini Chandershekhar and Pt. Harish Tiwari. A beautiful rendition of by Vid.
