# INTER-SCHOOL EVENTS ORGANISED BY SCHOOL

DPS Ludhiana hosted the Takshila Science Carnival centered on the pressing theme of Climate Change. It was an inter school competition that energized the campus with interactive exhibits, debates and quests. Students, dressed as climate activists, guided attendees through a transformative and enriching experience. The carnival featured diverse displays on solutions like Hydroponics, Solar Energy, and Smart Farming, art's role in awareness, waste - to - product innovations, competitions environmental on activism, and urgent climate debates. Through quizzes and model-making, students developed confidence, communication and interpersonal skills. They advised on exercising caution with emails, using unique passwords, and devices. securing The team emphasized on keeping anti-virus software updated, minimizing the use of public Wi-Fi, adjusting privacy settings, and reporting suspicious activities to enhance digital safety and addressed issues like cyber bullying and online fraud.
