**PARENTAL CIRCULAR**

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Dear Parent

As per the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the latest CBSE guidelines, the Three-Language Policy will be implemented from the Academic Session 2026–27. Under this policy, students will study three languages, of which at least two must be Bhartiya Bhashas (Indian languages). A foreign language may be chosen as the third language only if the other two are Indian languages. The policy aims to promote multilingual learning while ensuring that language education remains meaningful, enjoyable, and balanced.

The prescribed three-language formula that will be followed by our school is given below. The details can be perused [here](#).

- R1: English
- R2: Hindi
- R3: Marathi

Please note:

- For the current batch of Class VI (Academic Session 2026–27), the existing language combination will continue through Classes VII, VIII, IX and X.
- Since these students are already studying two Bhartiya Bhashas (R2 and R3) along with English, they fully comply with the CBSE language policy.
- When the present class VI batch reaches Class X (2030–31), the third language (R3) will be a CBSE Board examination subject.
- It is reiterated that there will be no change for students who are in Class X during 2026–27, and they will continue with the old system of two languages and no third language is required to be taken by this batch.
- When present Class VI batch and the subsequent Class VI batches progress to Class X, they shall take the Board examination of R3.
- For Classes VII– VIII (2026–27), the third language (R3) will be assessed by the school through an internal school-based assessment only.
- Students who are in Class VII or VIII in 2026–27. The third language (R3) will be assessed by the school through an internal school-based assessment only. There will be no CBSE Board examination for this third language when these batches progress to Class X.
- For class IX (2026–27) the third language (R3) will be assessed by the school through an internal school-based assessment only and there will be no CBSE Board examination for this third language when these batches progress to Class X.
