




डॉ. सर्वपल्ली राधाकृष्णन हे भारताचे एक महान शिक्षणतज्ज्ञ, तत्वज्ञानी आणि राजकारणी होते. ज्यांनी केवळ शिक्षण क्षेत्रात अतुलनीय योगदान दिले नाही तर भारताचे पहिले उपराष्ट्रपती आणि दुसरे राष्ट्रपती म्हणून देशाची सेवा देखील केली. त्यांचा जन्म \*५ सप्टेंबर १८८८\* रोजी आंध्र प्रदेशातील तिरुत्तानी गावात झाला. त्यांचा वाढदिवस भारतात शिक्षक दिन म्हणून साजरा केला जातो. राधाकृष्णनजी लहानपणापासूनच खूप हुशार होते. त्यांना तत्वज्ञानात खूप रस होता आणि त्यांनी मद्रास विद्यापीठातून पदवी आणि पदव्युत्तर पदवी प्राप्त केली. त्यांनी वेदांत आणि भारतीय संस्कृती योग्य पद्धतीने पाश्चात्य देशांसमोर सादर केली. भारतीय तत्वज्ञान, जीवनाचा हिंदू दृष्टिकोन" आणि \*पूर्वकडील धर्म आणि पाश्चात्य विचार" ही त्यांची पुस्तके आजही तत्वज्ञानाच्या क्षेत्रात मैलाचे दगड मानली जातात.

डॉ. राधाकृष्णन १९५२ मध्ये स्वतंत्र भारताचे पहिले उपराष्ट्रपती झाले आणि १९६२ मध्ये त्यांनी राष्ट्रपतीपदाची सूत्रे स्वीकारली. ते असे राष्ट्रपती होते ज्यांनी राजकारणात नैतिक मूल्ये जपली आणि नेहमीच शिक्षणाला अत्यंत महत्त्व दिले. जेव्हा ते राष्ट्रपती झाले तेव्हा काही विद्यार्थी आणि मित्रांनी त्यांचा वाढदिवस साजरा करण्याचा प्रस्ताव मांडला. डॉ. राधाकृष्णन यांनी विनम्रपणे सांगितले की "जर तुम्हाला माझा सन्मान करायचा असेल तर ५ सप्टेंबर हा शिक्षक दिन म्हणून साजरा करा." तेव्हापासून, भारतात दरवर्षी ५ सप्टेंबर रोजी \*शिक्षक दिन\* साजरा केला जातो. डॉ. सर्वपल्ली राधाकृष्णन हे असे व्यक्तिमत्व होते ज्यांनी आयुष्यभर ज्ञान, नैतिकता आणि शिक्षणाचे महत्त्व पसरवले.

आजही ते देशातील तरुणांसाठी आणि शिक्षकांसाठी प्रेरणास्त्रोत आहेत. त्यांचे जीवन हे या वस्तुस्थितीचे प्रतीक आहे की शिक्षण ही समाज आणि राष्ट्राची खरी ताकद आहे.

# आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस (कृत्रिम बुद्धिमत्ता): एक परिचय

आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस या ए.आई. आज हमारे जीवन का अभिन्न हिस्सा बन चुका है। यह मशीनों और कंप्यूटर सिस्टम का ऐसा समूह है, जो मिलकर वे कार्य कर सकता है जिनके लिए सामान्यतः मानव बुद्धि की आवश्यकता होती है। इसे समाधान निकालना, सीखना,

भाषा समझना और चित्र पहचानना जैसी क्षमताएँ उसके डेवलपर्स द्वारा सिखाई जाती हैं।

## ए.आई. की प्रगति

हालाँकि ए.आई. का विचार दशकों पुराना है, लेकिन हाल के वर्षों में इसकी उपलब्धियाँ असाधारण रही हैं। पहले कंप्यूटर केवल दिए गए आदेशों का पालन कर सकते थे, परंतु आज ए.आई. उन्हें स्वयं सीखने और निर्णय लेने में सक्षम बनाता है। यह प्रगति इंटरनेट पर उपलब्ध जानकारी और उन्नत प्रशिक्षण विधियों की वजह से संभव हुई है।

## ए.आई. के अनुप्रयोग

आज ए.आई. चिकित्सा, शिक्षा, व्यापार, उद्योग और सोशल मीडिया जैसे क्षेत्रों में तेजी से अपनी जगह बना रहा है। इसने जीवन को सरल बनाया है, लेकिन इसके प्रभावों को लेकर कई प्रश्न भी उठ रहे हैं।

## ए.आई. की चुनौतियाँ

ए.आई. के कारण नौकरियों के कम होने की आशंका व्यक्त की जा रही है। साथ ही, इसके दुरुपयोग और निजी जानकारी के लीक होने का खतरा भी है। इसलिए ज़रूरी है कि सख्त नियम बनाए जाएँ और इस तकनीक का विकास निष्पक्ष व सुरक्षित ढंग से किया जाए।

# SOCIAL MEDIA & SELF-ESTEEM: WHAT EVERY TEEN (AND PARENT) SHOULD KNOW
