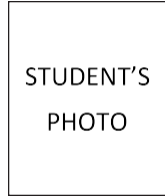

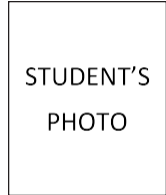

THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA

PREAMBLE

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a **SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC** and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social, economic and political

LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all

FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do **HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.**

1. Payment made towards the Prospectus and its processing (i.e. Registration) is non-refundable and does not guarantee applicant's admission.
2. Admission fees needs to be paid immediately once the admission is granted; failing which School has the right to offer the seat to the next candidate.
3. The Composite Fee needs to be paid quarterly by 10th of first month of the quarter. Any payments thereafter would attract late payment charges.
4. If however, 10th happens to be holiday/ closed day, payment must be made by the 9th of the month, as the case may be.
5. Though every care is exercised to upload the fee bills on time on ERP, it will be the responsibility of the parents to deposit the school dues on the due date.
6. The School fees does not include:
 - a. Books and Text Books
 - b. School Uniform and Footwear
 - c. Educational Excursions, representing school at Nationals student's workshop, youth science forums, admission in summer school/ domestic tours, participation in special school events and any expense borne towards their participation including the costumes, jewellery and props etc.
 - d. Hobby clubs/classes.

7. Transportation

- 1) Transportation fees is charged quarterly and as per route availed. It needs to be paid by 10th of first month of the quarter. In case of mid-term change of route or application for facility of transportation, transportation fees is due from the first day of month in which student is seeking transportation facility and needs to be paid for the months falling in a particular quarter, and thereafter to be paid quarterly.
- 2) Students, under no circumstances, should travel in the school bus without payment of the fee. If any student is found travelling in the school bus, without payment of bus fee, the bus fee will be recovered with effect from the beginning of the academic session in addition to late fee fine and penalty, for using bus without paying for the facility.
- 3) Transport fee is payable on quarterly basis, it is to be paid along with the Composite Fee before due date.
- 4) Students who avail the school transport facility should report at the pick-up point five minutes before the stipulated pickup time.
- 5) Students using school transport, will not be allowed to board a bus on any other bus route other than the one which has been assigned to them.
- 6) Students will be held responsible for any damage to buses caused by negligence or vandalism.
- 7) The driver's attention must not be distracted for any reason by the students.
- 8) The bus service provided by the school is a facility. We try to provide a good service and adhere to the timings to the best of our ability.
- 9) The buses will follow the routes and stops as indicated and no change will be entertained.
- 10) No student should come near the door of the bus unless it comes to a complete halt.
- 11) When the bus is in motion, students must not move around and no part of their body should be outside the bus.
- 12) Unruly behaviour like shrieking and shouting is strictly prohibited. Courteous behavior is expected at all times.
- 13) Parents/Guardian are responsible for supervising their children to/from their designated pickup/drop-off point until they board or alight from the vehicle. This may involve crossing roads. School personnel will not assist children to cross roads.

14) All possible efforts will be taken to see that the child is handed over to the parent/guardian while dropping back from school. In case the parents/guardians are not available to escort the child back home during drop time, the child will be brought back to school and it will be the responsibility of the parent to pick the child on their own from the school.

15) Please note that parents are not allowed to board the bus to discuss any kind of concern. In case any issue is to be discussed, please communicate to the Transport In charge only.

16) Mid Quarter withdrawal of transport service is not allowed. Transport fee will be charged for the entire quarter and no refund/ fee adjustment will be done.

17) Written request for withdrawal of the transport facility must be placed at least 30 days before start of the quarter.

18) Withdrawal of transport facility for class X and XII in the last quarter i.e. Jan-March is not allowed and no withdrawal request/ notice will be considered in this regard.

19) Bus facility will be provided from the next Monday after confirmation of the seat availability.

20) School reserves the right to stop the transport facility with immediate effect if the transport fee is not received on due date. Above rules and regulations will be applicable for all students availing school transport facility.

8. Mode of payment

a. Prospectus and Registration Charges - The fee needs to be paid in INR and through UPI/Credit/Debit Card only.

b. Admission/Composite/ Misc. Fees/ Digital Learning and Transportation fees - The fees need to be paid in INR only and can be paid online through School's ERP/ crossed cheque drawn in the favour of "Gaur's International School" /DD/ Debit/ Credit Card.

(In case of payment through Credit/Debit Card extra charges as applicable shall be borne by the Parent) Fees paid via Cheques needs to be deposited in FEE department of the School on all working days during school hours.(09:00AM - 04:00 PM).

9. Withdrawal And Refund

- Fees including all categories of fees are non-transferable under any circumstances.
- Prospectus Charges, Registration Charges are non-refundable.

- In case a student leaves the school for such compulsion as transfer of parents or for health reason or in case of death of the student before completion of the session, pro rata return of fees should be made. (Vide CBSE AFFILIATION BYE-LAWS Ref. No. 11.2)
- Application of withdrawal of admission is to be duly submitted to the Principal in writing, by 7th of the month preceding the month in which parent wishes to withdraw the child. In case of non- submission of application in time, fees in lieu of such notice will be payable.
- Application of withdrawal of transportation to be duly submitted to the Transport In charge /Principal in writing by 7th of the month preceding the month in which parent wishes to withdraw the transportation facility. In case of non-submission of application in time, transportation fees in lieu of such notice will be payable.
- The school leaving certificate will only be issued, only after clearance of all dues and on return of library books and fine.

10. Mid Term Admission

- Prospectus charges, Registration charges and Admission fees (One Time Payments) need to be paid in full and are non-refundable.
- Composite Fees - The school follows a monthly policy for mid-term admission. The fees will be charged from the month the child joins subject to the furnishing of previous school's fee receipt by parents. Fees will be charged on quarterly basis thereafter.
- Transport Fees is due from the first day of month in which student is seeking transportation facility and needs to be paid for the months of services availed falling in a particular quarter and thereafter to be paid quarterly.

10. Late Fees and Cheque Bouncing Charges

- All payments of Composite Fees, Other Fees and Transportation fees after due dates would attract late payment charges of Rs. 50/- per day starting from the next day after due date to the date of payment.
- In case of bouncing of Cheque, Cheque bouncing charges of Rs. 300/- would be payable and only DD/Credit/Debit Card shall be accepted.
- In case of payment through Credit/Debit Card, extra charges as applicable shall be borne by the Parent.

Gaurs International School, reserves all rights to increase all fees/charges and set regulations when needed and found necessary. The information given in the school's brochure and application material is an indication of Gaurs International School's intent as on the date of publication of this document. The contents of this policy should not to be construed as a binding contract upon Gaurs International School and cannot be legally challenged.

SCHOOL LIBRARY

The school library has a variety of resources ranging from various genres of books by different authors, magazines, journal etc. We seek to introduce and immerse our children in the world of literature. This will naturally encourage our children to discover the beauty and complexity of the world by their own experience. The school library is open to all bonafide students of the school, during school hours. Each class is allotted at least one library period per week. The aim of the school library is to help the student acquire the habit of reading. Parents are advised to motivate their ward to cultivate the habit of reading and to make maximum use of this facility.

LIBRARY RULES AND POLICY

1. All students and staff of the school are members of the library.
2. A student can borrow only one book at a time for a period of two weeks.
3. A staff member can borrow maximum three books at a time for a period of one month.
4. Books will be issued to the students, during the library periods. No book will be issued or returned during the teaching hours.
5. Books will be issued to the staff, after the school hours and on Saturdays. No book will be issued or returned during the teaching hours.
6. Marking, underlining or writing on library books, periodicals and newspapers is strictly forbidden.
7. Reference books and current periodicals will not be issued to any student. These can be read only in the library room.
8. If the books are not returned within a specified time, fine of Rs 5/- will be charged per day after the due date. (Due date can be checked on ERP).
9. In case the book is misused, wrongly handled or lost, the Student will have to replace the book or pay the full price of the book.
10. After reading, make sure that the books, periodicals and newspapers are kept back at their respective places.
11. The members should take good care of library furnishings and equipment. Make sure the library looks good when you leave as it did when you came in.
12. Eatables are not allowed in the Library.
13. A 'No Dues Certificate' by each member is to be obtained from the librarian while withdrawing from the school.
14. Strict silence and discipline to be maintained in the library.

School Discipline Policy

Gaurs International School promotes discipline and encourages good behaviour by establishing well-defined rules and policies. These rules are in line with CBSE guidelines and are being effectively communicated to both students and their parents. These rules are being issued as guidelines for different aspects of school life.

General Guidelines for Parents/Guardians:

- Parents/Guardians are requested to co-operate with the school in our effort to foster the growth and development of their children.
- They are requested to send their wards in proper school uniform, to ensure that students are punctual to school and to be vigilant that their wards come to school with necessary books and stationery, adhere to the discipline of the school and participate in school activities.
- Parents are requested not to enter the classrooms to see their children or teachers during school hours.
- Parents are required to inform the school if there is any change in their address, telephone numbers and email ID in the prescribed proforma available at School Office.
- In order to provide immediate medical attention in case of emergency, parents are requested to send a photocopy of the health registration card of their child.
- Encourage your child to participate in all the activities of the school.
- Parents' attention is drawn to the fact that criticism of the school or teacher in the presence of a child should be scrupulously avoided because it causes the students to lose respect for their teachers and consequently, they fail to learn from them. This also retards the student's progress.
- Should there be any legitimate complaint, please meet the Class Teacher/HM at the earliest or send a written complaint which will be personally looked into.
- Suggestions given by the parents in a cooperative and constructive spirit are always welcome and will be given due consideration.
- Any communication made by the parent/guardian should be addressed to the Class Teacher/HM and sent through the Class Teacher. The name of the student, address, phone number, enrollment number and class/section should be clearly mentioned in the application.
- Parents are required to cooperate with the school in order to help their children progress by paying attention to their regularity, punctuality and discipline and to take interest in their ward's work. They should check the bags of their wards, Almanac and ERP to see the homework/circular/notice/invitation etc. on daily basis.
- Care must be taken of all school property and if any damage is done it will be compensated for by the concerned student together with a payment of fine imposed for the offense. The student will also have to face strict disciplinary action as decided by the school authorities.
- It is compulsory for all students to attend school on the re-opening day after a vacation.

- Absence of a student just before and immediately after the vacation would attract strict disciplinary action against him/her.
- The wards of those parents, who avoid meeting the authorities, when advised to do so, may not be allowed to attend classes.
- Parents are requested to personally see off and receive their wards at bus stops along with parent's Authorization Card.
- Parents are requested not to send their child to school if they are medically unfit. If a pupil is absent due to illness for more than 3 days, the school must be informed at once.
- Parents will understand that absence of their ward during the term is not in their best interest.
- They are asked not to apply for leave if avoidable. Leave can be granted to the student only on the following grounds:
 - ▶ Serious illness or death of a very near relative.
 - ▶ For a condolence visit, if custom so demands.
 - ▶ To attend a marriage in the family.
- Parents must first consult the School Almanac/Calendar/ERP or other circulars before making inquiries over the phone.
- Parents and guardians are requested to read and explain the school rules to their wards.
- Collection and distribution of lunch packets and other belongings is not the responsibility of the school.
- Students are not allowed to bring expensive sweets, presents, etc. to school for any occasion like birthdays, Teachers' Day, Children's Day or on any other festival. Only small biscuit packets are allowed on birthdays.
- Parents are requested not to enter the school bus when they come to pick or drop their ward.
- Parents should not try to overtake and stop the school bus to facilitate the boarding of their wards as this endangers the safety of the bus occupants. Such attempts would lead to strict disciplinary action.
- Parents should not argue with the teachers present in the bus or the conductor/driver. If there is any problem, a written complaint to the Principal/In charge or School Office should be given.
- Parents or their representatives are requested to carry the Parent's Authorization Card when visiting the school to attend any function organized by the school or to collect their wards.
- Our School is a poly bag-free zone. Parents are requested not to send or bring any articles like tiffin, stationery, craft articles etc. to school in poly bags.
- Parents must pick-up their wards within 15 minutes of dispersal time and should drop them within 15 minutes of start of the school.
- Parents/Guardians are expected to be very particular to see that their children return home immediately after school hours except on days when they stay on for co-curricular activities. It may be noted that the responsibility of the authorities ceases immediately after school hours.
- The School Management reserves the right to admit or not to admit any child and to revise the rules and regulations at any time if considered necessary.

School Rules & Regulation for Students:

- Students must be punctual in reaching the school by 7:45 am. The school gate will close at 8:00 am and no one will be allowed entry after 8:00 am.
- It is mandatory for the students to wear ID card every day.
- All the students must follow the dress code prescribed by the school. When everyone dresses similarly, it promotes unity and a sense of belonging among children.
- School has introduced the RFID attendance system. It is mandatory for the students to wear RFID cards to school.
- The parents and self-walkers should carry the versionX card daily for the dispersal of the child.
- All students must bring the school diary every day.
- Speaking of English is enforced in the school and within the school premises.
- Students will not be allowed to enter the school on short leave. In case of a medical or any other emergency the child will be allowed to leave the school. A gate pass will be issued from the school reception. The child should be accompanied either by parents or an authorized person.
- Movement of students from one classroom to another should be in a peaceful and orderly manner. Students should not unnecessarily leave their class at the end of every period.
- Running, playing, shouting inside the school building is not allowed. Silence must be observed when changing classes for sports period, co-curricular activities and other subjects.
- Students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed. The school uniform should be worn on all working days and for all school functions. Students who are slovenly dressed or not in uniform will be sent home. Use of hair gel is not allowed. Wearing low waist trousers and short skirts is forbidden.
- All boys, except Sikhs must keep their hair short. Sikhs are allowed to wear black turban. Girls must tie their hair neatly with a black band.
- No books (other than text books or library books), magazines or newspaper should be brought to the school.
- Students are expected to respect the school property such as smart boards, computers and equipment in the auditorium. No student should damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage things belonging to others. Any school property damaged even by accident should be reported at once to the Class teachers/HMs/Principal.
- Bullying and use of foul language are punishable offences. Bullying in class or cyber bullying is a punishable offence.
- At all times students are expected to be polite and courteous towards other students and the staff.
- Students are not allowed to bring any sharp instruments such as knives, blades, sharp edged tools, etc. to the school, or any kind of object which may cause injury to others.
- Students are advised to keep their class room, school buildings and campus as clean as possible, and throw leftovers into the dustbins.
- Buying and using of e-cigarettes/hookah/tobacco in the school campus is totally banned. If somebody is found carrying these items, strict disciplinary action will be taken.

- Students are not allowed to wear any jewellery. The school is not responsible for goods lost. It is advisable not to bring valuable articles (like expensive watches/fountain pens, cash, jewellery/bracelets/ear studs etc.) to school.
- GIS provides education from Pre-nursery to Class XII. Therefore, it is expected that the Juniors be treated with love and affection, while the juniors show respect to their seniors.
- Students are not allowed to carry mobile phones or any other electronic devices to school.
- Streaking and colouring of hair is not permitted.
- It's important for all students to show up to school on time so that they are able to participate in all the class/school activities. Being punctual not only shows respect for the teachers and classmates but also sets a positive tone for the day and helps the students make the most of their educational experience.
- No collection of money/gifts for any purpose is to be made or encouraged.
- Exploding crackers or splashing colours during Diwali / Holi or on any other occasion in the school premises or school buses is strictly forbidden. Non-compliance to these instructions can result in expulsion from the school.
- Students are instructed not to play in the classroom or use cricket bats or hockey sticks except on the playground. The cost of repairs caused by damage to school property will be charged to the concerned child and can lead to the child's suspension from school.
- Students using the Computer, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics, Humanities or any other lab are expected to be careful while using the equipment and to follow the Lab rules strictly.
- No chewing gum or stimulant is permitted anywhere in the campus.
- The school has zero tolerance policy for physical violence/bullying/indiscipline.
- AC, Light and fan should be switched off when not in use. Student should also ensure that there is no wastage of water.
- Students should be made to be responsible to take care of their personal belongings.
- Students are responsible to the school authorities not only for their conduct in the school but also for their general behavior outside. Any reported objectionable conduct out of the school premises on the part of pupils will make them liable for disciplinary action.

Disciplinary Measures

► Students will be liable for written warning/punishment on the following grounds:

- Violent behaviour/aggressive behaviour
- Insubordination
- Use of abusive language
- Cheating in examination

- Playing Holi or Bursting Crackers in the school campus

► **The following disciplinary measures may be adopted by the school in dealing with students behaving in an unruly manner:**

- Oral warning and counselling.
- Written warning.
- Issue of Yellow, Black & Red Cards.

► **Yellow Card:**

This is a warning card and may be issued for various offences as listed below:

- ▶ The scholarship will be valid only for a period as per the tenure specified.
- ▶ The scholarship will be initially awarded for a period of one academic year and subsequently renewed for another academic year subject to the review of Student's performance which should be 95% and above. The student must achieve at least a score equivalent to the category based on which scholarship was granted to him/her.
