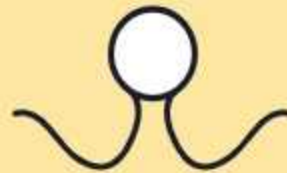

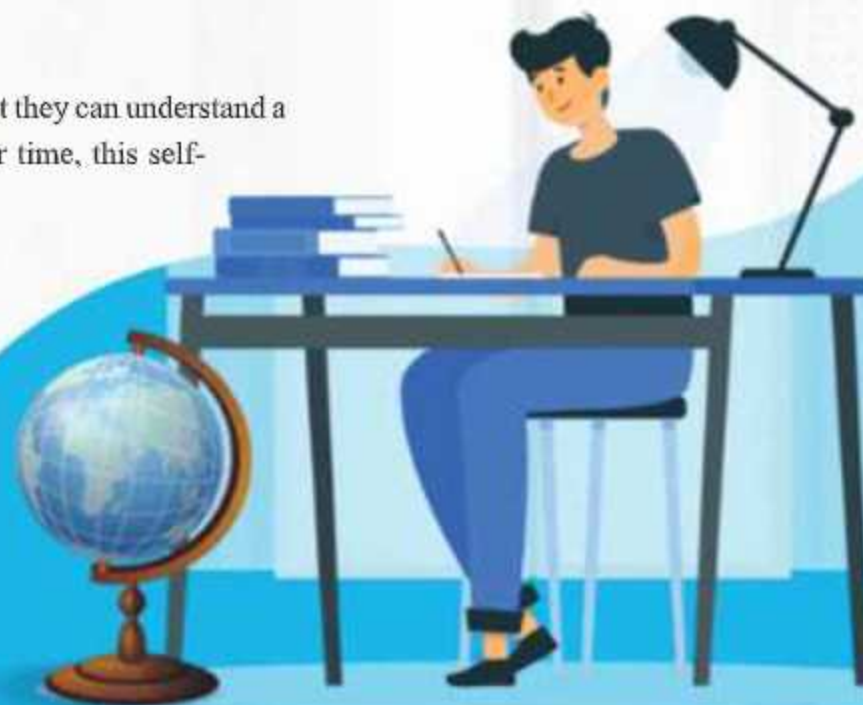

A Miracle Language



English is truly a miracle language. Why is it a miracle? Let's find out.

It starts with just 26 letters in the alphabet, yet it includes a total of 44 phonetic sounds (phonemes), which consist of:

18 consonant sounds

7 digraphs

5 R-controlled sounds

5 long vowels

5 short vowels

2 "oo" sounds

2 diphthongs

These sounds form the foundation of spoken English. The ability to hear, identify, and manipulate individual sounds in spoken words is essential. This includes tasks like blending sounds to make words, segmenting words into sounds, and substituting or deleting sounds.

Phases of Phonics:

Phonemic awareness

Letter sounds

Digraphs and blends

Long vowels and tricky words

Alternative spellings

Then come CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant) and CCVC words, followed by syllables. After that, we move on to reading words, sentences, and paragraphs. This naturally becomes a part of vocabulary development.

As we go deeper, we explore parts of speech. English is a miracle because a single word can play many roles - as a noun, verb, adjective, or adverb.

There's also magic in English, like palindrome words - words that read the same forward and backward.

Some examples: rotor, civic, racecar, eye, pop, deed.

Palindrome sentence: "Mr. Owl ate my metal worm."

Another Wonder: Homophones

These are words that sound alike but have different spellings and meanings.

Examples: pair/pear, flower/flour, sea/see.

Rhyming Words

Words that sound similar at the end:

Cat-mat, nice-trice, noon-moon.

Punctuation - A Powerful Tool

Punctuation plays a vital role in English grammar. Misplaced punctuation can change a sentence's meaning completely.

For example:

"Let's eat Grandma."

"Let's eat, Grandma."

These two sentences have very different meanings, simply because of a comma!

The Role of Poetry

English literature includes countless beautiful poems written by great poets. It's impossible to know the exact number, as new poems are constantly being written and published.

Literary Devices

Literary devices enhance a writer's ability to express ideas, create imagery, and convey deeper meaning.

Here's an example using several literary devices:

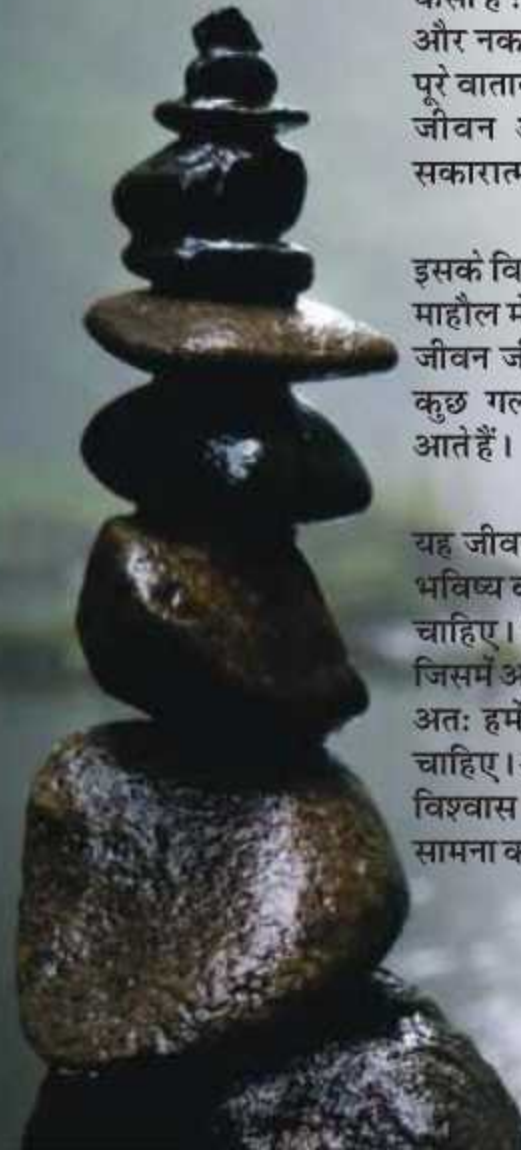

महनसर (झुंझुनूँ): एक सांस्कृतिक विरासत एवं धरोहर



राजस्थान के झुंझुनूँ जिले में स्थित महनसर गाँव की स्थापना सन् 1768 में ठाकुर नवल सिंह द्वारा की गई थी। यह गाँव शेखावाटी क्षेत्र की सांस्कृतिक, कलात्मक और ऐतिहासिक धरोहर के रूप में प्रसिद्ध है। महनसर की पहचान इसकी भव्य हवेलियों, मंदिरों और कलात्मक भित्ति चित्रकारी से होती है। यहाँ की प्रसिद्ध सोने की दुकान (Golden Shop) विश्वप्रसिद्ध है जिसे सेठ हरकंठ राय पोद्दार ने सन 1846-50 के बीच बनवाया। जिसकी दीवारों पर भगवान विष्णु के 24 अवतार, कृष्ण लीला और रामायण के सुंदर-दृश्य चित्रित हैं। इन चित्रों में सोने की धातु का उपयोग किया गया है, जो इन्हें अत्यंत आकर्षक बनाता है।



यहाँ का सेठ तोलाराम जी का कमरा (Dancing hall) और रघुनाथ जी का बड़ा मंदिर स्थापत्य कला के उत्कृष्ट उदाहरण हैं, जिसमें मूँछों वाले शिव की सपरिवार प्रतिमा है। ऐतिहासिक गढ़ महनसर गाँव के गौरवशाली इतिहास की पहचान है। महनसर का एक और प्रसिद्ध आकर्षण है महारानी हेरिटेज लिकर (Wine), जो पारंपरिक राजस्थानी विधि से तैयार की जाती है और देश-विदेश में प्रसिद्ध है।

हर वर्ष यहाँ हजारों देशी-विदेशी पर्यटक आते हैं। उनके ठहरने के लिए हवेली केशर विलास होटल, नारायण निवास कैसल होटल और महनसर फोर्ट होटल संचालित हैं, जो राजस्थान की "अतिथि देवो भव" परंपरा को जीवंत रखते हैं।

इस प्रकार महनसर, झुंझुनूँ की धरती पर बसी एक जीवंत सांस्कृतिक विरासत और पर्यटन धरोहर है, जो राजस्थान की गौरवगाथा को सजीव करती है।

माँ : एक योद्धा और संरक्षक



“मैं जो कुछ भी हूँ, या बनने की आशा करता हूँ, उसका श्रेय मेरी देवदूत समान माँ को जाता है।” – अब्राहम लिंकन

जब हम किसी योद्धा की कल्पना करते हैं, तो अक्सर हमारे सामने एक ऐसा व्यक्ति आता है जो कवच पहने, हथियार थामे युद्धभूमि में खड़ा है। लेकिन सच्चा योद्धा तो वही है, जिससे हम हर दिन मिलते हैं – एक माँ। उसके पास तलवार नहीं होती, लेकिन उसके पास अटूट साहस, अडिग आत्मा और अपने बच्चों के लिए अथाह प्रेम होता है, जो उन्हें जीवन के हर तूफान से बचाता है।

शैक्षिक क्रांति के पथ पर अग्रसर भारत



किसी समय का विश्व गुरु रहा भारत पिछले 34 वर्षों से चली आ रही शिक्षा नीति को एक नए सांचे में ढालकर भविष्य की उड़ान के लिए तत्पर है। वर्तमान केंद्र सरकार ने शिक्षा जैसे आधारभूत ढांचे को मजबूत बनाने के लिए जो मसौदा तैयार किया है यदि वह तय मानकों के साथ जमीनी स्तर पर उतरेगा तो आमूलचूल परिवर्तन होना तय है। और वे परिवर्तन भारतीय समाज को नैतिकता, संस्कृति व संस्कार जैसे तत्वों से जोड़े रखने में सफल होंगे ऐसी उम्मीद है। प्राथमिक शिक्षा में किया गया बदलाव यह दर्शाता है कि बच्चे को यदि उसके वातावरण और प्रत्यक्ष ज्ञान पर आधारित शिक्षा दी जाएगी तो वह उसके लिए नींव का पत्थर साबित होगी। जहां पूर्व प्राथमिक शिक्षा आंगनबाड़ियों के माध्यम से देकर बच्चे में जिज्ञासा व खेल-खेल में सीखने जैसे गुण विकसित किए जाएंगे, वहीं दूसरी ओर मातृभाषा में पढ़ाने से बालक के शैक्षिक आधार को तैयार करने में विद्यालय, परिवार, समाज तथा वातावरण की सक्रियता बढ़ी हुई नजर आएगी। इसके साथ-साथ प्रत्येक बच्चे की विशिष्ट क्षमताओं को स्वीकृति और पहचान मिलने का दायरा भी बढ़ेगा। यदि उच्च प्राथमिक स्तर की नई नीतियों पर दृष्टिपात करें तो हम पाते हैं कि कौशल विकास के प्रति सकारात्मकता गांधीजी की बुनियादी शिक्षा का अनुसरण हो सकती है। साथ ही त्रिभाषा सूत्र को एक नया रूप देकर भारतीय भाषाओं को सुदृढ़ करने का कार्य बखूबी किया जा सकेगा। परीक्षाओं के स्वरूप में भी संतुलित रूप से जिस परिवर्तन की ओर कदम बढ़ाया गया है वह परीक्षा के भय को कम करते हुए छात्र के विवेक व चिंतन को बढ़ावा देगा जिससे रटत प्रणाली व केवल लिखित परीक्षा प्राप्तियों पर आधारित परिणाम के द्वारा भविष्य के मानक तय करने वाली सोच के पोषण में कमी लाएगा।

वहीं कॉलेज शिक्षा को और अधिक पारदर्शिता के दायरे में लाने के लिए एक तरफ जहां छात्र किसी भी विषय के अध्ययन हेतु स्वतंत्र होगा वहीं दूसरी तरफ विश्वविद्यालयों में प्रवेश परीक्षा का सिद्धांत एक समान होने से छात्रों को उच्च शिक्षा का पूर्ण अवसर भी मिल सकेगा। इसके साथ-साथ तकनीकी शिक्षा के यथा संभव उपयोग पर जोर देकर दिव्यांग बच्चों की शिक्षा को सुलभ बनाने का काम भी हो सकेगा। आज तक जो अध्यापक कई प्रकार के कार्यों में व्यस्त रहता था उसे भी अब अपनी संपूर्ण ऊर्जा को बालक के सर्वांगीण विकास हेतु खर्च करने का पूर्ण अवसर मिलेगा।

बचपन में रंग बिरंगी कैंडीज, जेली और आइसक्रीम हमारे पसंदीदा रहे हैं। हमारे टीनएज में माउथफ्रेशर और चूड़ंगम, एवं योगहर्ट और बाद में विटामिन ए, डी अथवा इ के कैप्सूल आदि हमने कभी न कभी जरूर लिए हैं।

जेलाटिन में 84-90 % तक जल में घुलनशील प्रोटीन होता है, 1-2 % मिनरल साल्ट और 15-8 % तक पानी। यह कोलेजन प्रोटीन होता है जिसका मुख्य स्रोत जानवरों की त्वचा, अस्थियाँ और कनेक्टिव टिशू होते हैं। यह मुख्य रूप से पोर्क, बीफ एवं मछली से प्राप्त होता है।

बहुत सारी कन्फेक्शनरी कंपनियाँ जेलाटिन का उपयोग जेली, टॉफी, कैंडीज, चूड़ंग गम बनाने में करती हैं। जेलाटिन का उपयोग डेरी उद्योग में विभिन्न उत्पाद जैसे योगहर्ट, आइसक्रीम, मिल्क क्रीम, बनाने में, एवं कुछ कंपनियाँ जेलाटिन का उपयोग शराब, बियर बनाने में और दवाएं बनाने में भी करती हैं।

कारमाइन एक प्राकृतिक रंग है जो कि फीमेल कोचिनाल स्केल इंसेक्ट्स को कुचल कर प्राप्त किया जाता है। इसे लिपस्टिक में बड़े पैमाने पर उपयोग करते हैं।

जेलाटिन के इतने बड़े पैमाने पर उपयोग को देखते हुए एवं कुछ धार्मिक कारणों से ऐसे जेलाटिन की विशेष मांग हुई जो शाकाहारी लोग प्रयोग कर सकें। अगर-अगर, पेक्टिन, स्टार्च, एवं कररगीन शाकाहारी जेलाटिन के उद्धारण हैं।

किसी भी उत्पाद को खरीदने से पहले हमें उस पर लिखी प्रयुक्त सामग्री के बारे में विस्तार से जानने की आवश्यकता है। उपभोक्ता के रूप में हमें अधिक जागरूक रहने एवं सजग रहने की आवश्यकता है।

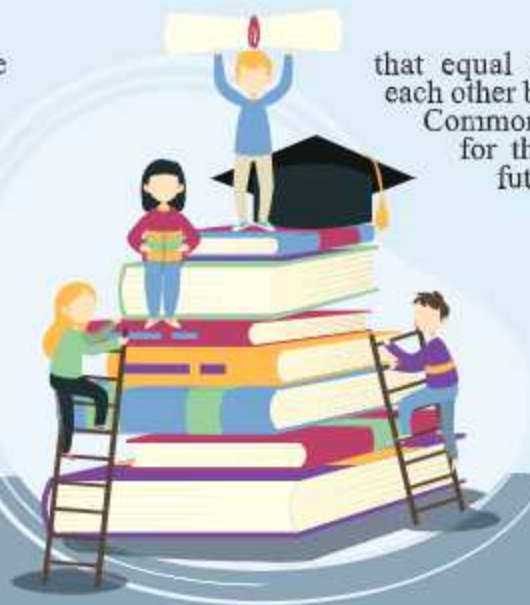

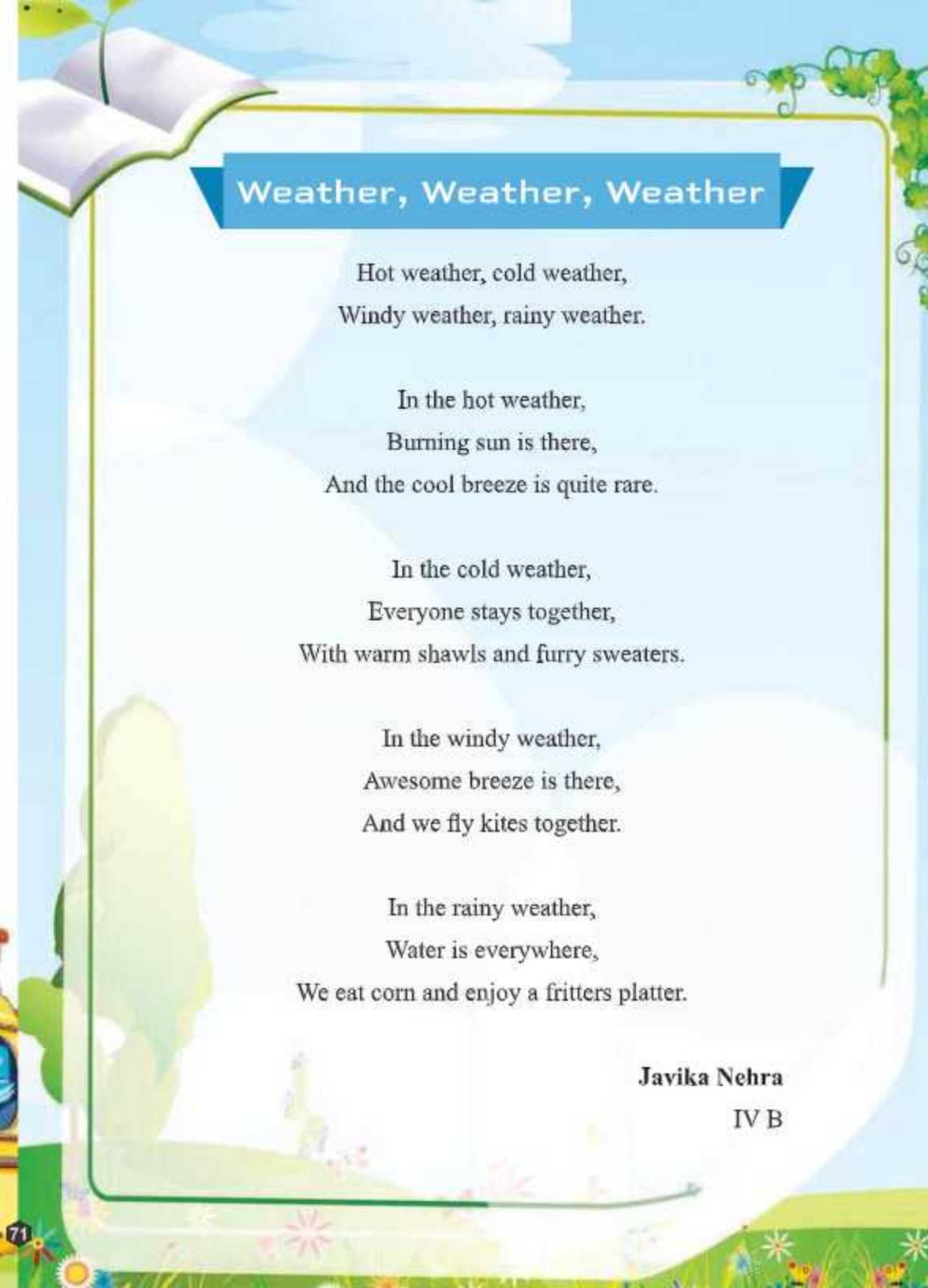

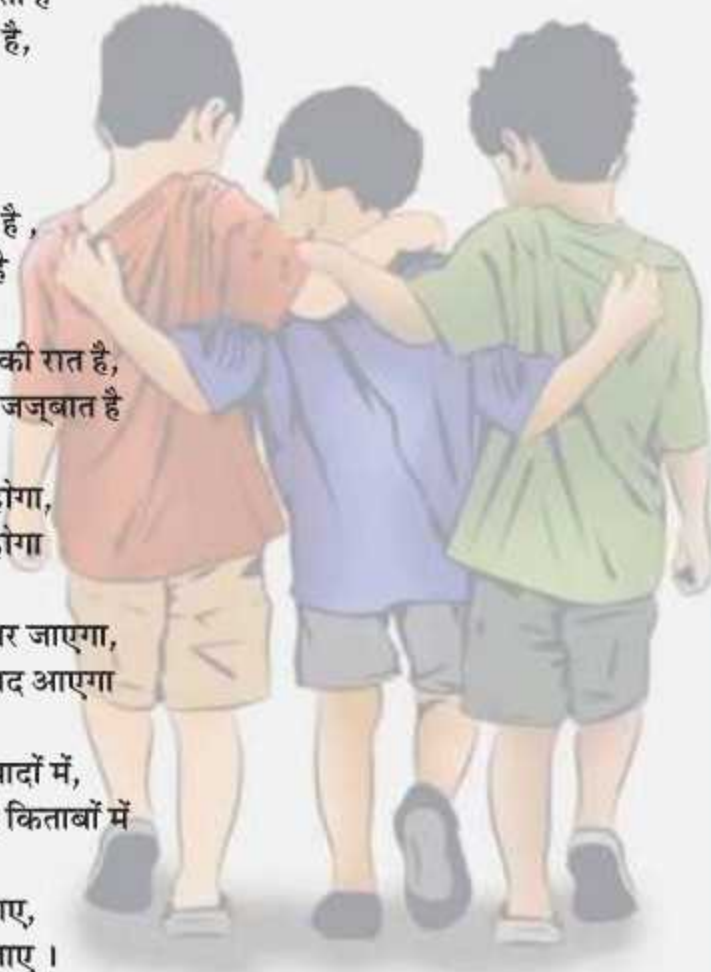

फुटबॉल

फुटबॉल एक बहुत ही लोकप्रिय खेल है, जिसे दुनिया भर में बड़े उत्साह और जुनून के साथ खेल और देखा जाता है। यह खेल टीम भावना, शारीरिक क्षमता, मानसिक एकाग्रता और रणनीतिक कौशल का अद्भुत संगम है। फुटबॉल का खेल दो टीमों के बीच खेला जाता है, जिसमें प्रत्येक टीम में 11 खिलाड़ी होते हैं। इसका मुख्य उद्देश्य टीम के गोल पोस्ट में गेंद को पहुँचाना होता है। फुटबॉल का इतिहास बहुत पुराना है। ऐसा माना जाता है कि फुटबॉल का प्रारंभ चीन में हुआ था, लेकिन आधुनिक फुटबॉल का प्रारंभ 19वीं शताब्दी में इंग्लैंड में हुआ। 1863 में इंग्लैंड में फुटबॉल एसोसिएशन की स्थापना हुई, जिसके बाद इस खेल के नियम निर्धारित किए गए। वर्तमान समय में फुटबॉल विश्व का सबसे लोकप्रिय खेल है, और इसे हर महाद्वीप में खेला जाता है। इस खेल के नियम सरल होते हैं। खेल को 90 मिनट के दो हिस्सों में बांटा जाता है, जिसमें प्रत्येक आधा 45 मिनट का होता है। खिलाड़ियों को अपने पैर, सिर या छाती का उपयोग करके गेंद को पास करना होता है, लेकिन हाथ का उपयोग केवल गोलकीपर कर सकता है। खेल के अंत में वह टीम जीतती है जिसने अधिक गोल किए हों। यह एक ऐसा खेल है जो न केवल मनोरंजन प्रदान करता है, बल्कि यह खिलाड़ियों के शारीरिक, मानसिक और सामाजिक विकास में भी सहायक होता है। यह खेल पूरी दुनिया में लोगों को एकजुट करता है और उनके बीच आपसी सहयोग और प्रतिस्पर्धा की भावना को प्रोत्साहित करता है। इसलिए फुटबॉल को "दुनिया का खेल" कहा जाता है।

राजस्थान पुलिस

अगस्त 1947 में स्वतंत्रता प्राप्ति के साथ भारत की 563 रियासतों को धीरे-धीरे विभिन्न प्रशासनिक सजातीय इकाइयों में एकीकृत किया गया था। राजस्थान राज्य अपने वर्तमान स्वरूप में विभिन्न चरणों में अस्तित्व में आया था। आजादी के बाद शुरू हुई ये प्रक्रिया साल 1956 में पूर्ण तब हुई जब समस्त रियासतों को मिलाकर राजस्थान अपने वर्तमान स्वरूप में आया। राजस्थान को बनाने वाली तत्कालीन रियासतों के आकार, जनसंख्या, राजस्व संसाधनों, प्रशासनिक प्रक्रियाओं और प्रथाओं में काफी भिन्नता थी। यह कानून और व्यवस्था के कार्यों के लिए बनाए गए सुरक्षा बलों की संरचना और क्षमता में विविध रूप से परिलक्षित होता था। हालांकि इन राज्यों के विलय के साथ उनके पुलिस वालों को एक ही पुलिस बल में मिला दिया गया जिसे राजस्थान पुलिस के रूप में जाना जाता था। अपनी स्थापना के बाद के शुरुआती वर्षों में राजस्थान पुलिस की अध्यक्षता प्रतिनिधि अधिकारियों द्वारा की जाती थी। पहले पुलिस महानिरीक्षक श्री आर बनर्जी थे जिन्होंने 7 अप्रैल 1949 को पदभार संभाला था। श्री बनर्जी ने 7 महीने इस पद पर सेवाएं दी और उन्होंने इस अवधि के दौरान विभिन्न पुलिस वालों के एकीकरण के आवश्यक प्रारंभिक कार्यों के लिए किए गए प्रयासों में अहम भूमिका निभाई। उन्होंने राजस्थान पुलिस विनियम के संयुक्त राज्य राजस्थान के लिए एक सामान्य पुलिस को तैयार किया। जनवरी 1951 में राजस्थान पुलिस सेवा का गठन किया गया और पूरे राज्य से अधिकारियों की नियुक्ति की गई। इन प्रयासों ने राजस्थान पुलिस को वह स्वरूप प्रदान किया जिसे कि हम आज जानते हैं। राजस्थान को देश का सबसे शांतिपूर्ण राज्यों में से एक होने का अनुठा गौरव प्राप्त है। जनवरी 1951 में स्थापित राजस्थान पुलिस आज लगभग 95000 कर्मचारी वाला एक मजबूत पुलिस बल है जो पिछले कुछ वर्षों में संगठन, उपकरण, परिचालन, तकनीक, रवैया और दृष्टिकोण में लगातार विकसित हुआ है। पिछले 73 वर्षों में चाहे वह चंबल के बीहड़ में डकैतों का आतंक को या संगठित अपराधियों का आतंक पर लगाम राजस्थान पुलिस की कहानी, उपलब्धियां और गौरव की गाथा है। अपराध और व्यवस्था की ओर झुकाव रखने वाले लोग राजस्थान पुलिस से डरते हैं। राजस्थान पुलिस अपने लोगों को अपनी सबसे मूल्यवान संपत्ति मानती है और निरंतर प्रतिबद्धता, विनम्रता और विश्वास के साथ उनकी सेवा करती है। राजस्थान पुलिस 21वीं सदी की चुनौतियों से निपटने के लिए पूरी तरह से तैयार है। ऊंटों और घोड़ों के दिन गए। आज राजस्थान पुलिस आधुनिक फॉरेंसिक विज्ञान प्रयोगशाला, उन्नत दूरसंचार सुविधाओं और अब सूचना प्रौद्योगिकी जैसे आधुनिक उपकरणों के साथ एक उच्च प्रशिक्षित बल है। हालांकि, जो नहीं बदला है, वह है भाईचारा जो हर एक पुलिसकर्मी को एक परिवार का हिस्सा महसूस कराता है क्योंकि वह राजस्थान पुलिस के हमारे आदर्श वाक्य 'सेवार्थ कटिबद्धता' की सच्ची भावना से काम करने की कोशिश करता है।

The lost city of Atlantis, detailed by Plato around 360 BCE in his dialogues *Timaeus* and *Critias*, describes an advanced, utopian island civilization beyond the Pillars of Hercules that grew morally corrupt and was swallowed by the sea in a single day and night as divine punishment. While most historians view Atlantis as a philosophical allegory about human hubris rather than a historical place, its rich imagery of advanced architecture, powerful military, and eventual divine destruction has captivated imaginations for centuries, leading to endless speculation and countless theories about its potential existence and location.



Plato portrayed Atlantis as an island paradise, founded by the god Poseidon, featuring concentric circles of land and water connected by canals, opulent palaces, and powerful resources. The Atlanteans, initially virtuous, became greedy and warlike, ultimately launching an invasion of the Mediterranean. After their defeat by ancient Athens, the gods, displeased with their corruption, caused the island to sink into the ocean.

While the story is generally accepted as a fictional device to illustrate philosophical concepts, some theories suggest it may have been inspired by real events, such as the catastrophic volcanic eruption on the island of Thera (Santorini) around 1500 BCE, which devastated the Minoan civilization. However, despite numerous underwater expeditions and proposed locations, no definitive archaeological evidence of Atlantis has ever been found, cementing its status as one of history's most enduring and enchanting myths.

Atlantis is an island nation mentioned in two of the Greek philosopher Plato's most famous dialogues, *Timaeus* and *Critias*. In them, he describes the ancient civilization as peaceful and vastly wealthy, protected by the sea god Poseidon. But although it's one of his most famous stories, it's almost certainly false.

Climate Change: Geopolitics & The Lost River

As the planet warms, ice melts, seas rise, cloud bursts, and droughts intensify — but behind these environmental changes, something bigger is happening: countries are adjusting their strategies, fighting over resources, and redefining alliances to fight the ever-rising problems that are extremely harmful for their ever-rising status. This is geopolitics. On the other hand, we have also lost a mighty river under the shadows of climate change many million years ago - the Saraswati

GEOPOLITICS:

As Arctic ice continues to melt due to rising temperatures, previously inaccessible oil, gas, and shipping routes are now opening. Countries such as Russia, the USA, Canada, and even China are scrambling to secure influence in this region. Russia has increased its military presence in Arctic; China calling itself a near arctic state, seeks control over the trade routes.

The Grand Ethiopia Renaissance Dam (GERD), built by Ethiopia on the Blue Nile, has triggered a major dispute with Egypt. Egypt depends on the Nile for more than 90% of its water, and any reduction in the flow is seen as a national threat. Climate change worsens this conflict by reducing rainfall and making the Nile's flow even more unpredictable.

The Brahmaputra River flows from Tibet to India and Bangladesh. China has built several dams upstream, leading to tension with India and Bangladesh. India worries about floods or sudden water shortages. Bangladesh fears downstream droughts and rising salinity due to reduced freshwater. Climate change makes this situation worse, as glaciers feeding the river melt faster, and monsoons become more extreme.

Iraq is facing severe water scarcity, partly due to climate change and partly because of the upstream dams in Turkey and Iran. The Tigris and Euphrates rivers are drying up, affecting farming, electricity and drinking water. Some experts believe drought and failed crops helped fuel extremist movements like ISIS.

Droughts, flooding, and rising sea levels are displacing millions. Areas like Lake Chad, the Sunderbans, and parts of Odisha, are seeing forced relocation.

Displaced populations can strain resources and spark social tensions or even violence in receiving areas. Rising seas could submerge over 60% of US naval bases by the late century, while extreme heat hinders operations in places like Iraq.

THE LOST RIVER:

India was known as the land of seven rivers - SAPTASINDHU- in the Rigveda. At those times, there used to be a mighty river flowing through India -the Saraswati. Historians and geologists mark its course in the past by originating in the Himalayas and flowing east, then slightly turning west and finally draining into the Arabian Sea. Oldham in 1893 conducted some research, under GSI, and discovered some paleochannels in Punjab and Haryana. Later he gave the thought that the river was once the part of the Nara Hakra Ghaggar river channels. In 1874, before this incident, the GSI conducted the lost river of that desert in which Indologists declared the river as a part of Ghaggar Hakra river system. The whole system dried before the decline of the Indus valley. ISRO has also gone through the paleochannels in Jaisalmer and discovered that the presence of carbon and tritium in the groundwater is substantially due to Himalayan water that was belonging to a river.

But the question is where it went and how. Well theories do suggest that due to change in monsoon pattern the river has dried up. The river disappeared due to low river dynamics around 3000 BCE and became a reason behind the demolishing of few western Harappan sites like Kalibangan.

CLIMATE CHANGE is no longer a distant environmental concern- it's a force with profound geopolitical consequences. From melting ice to shifting resources migration patterns, it's transforming how nations strategies, compete and cope. Preparing for this emerging reality will require climate aware-diplomacy **OTHERWISE** we will be witnessing some more rivers, forests and nature's creations to get depleted Stop before it becomes your reality

Nalanda University: The Pride Of Ancient India

Nalanda University, also called *Nalanda Mahavihara*, was founded in the 5th century CE during the reign of *Kumara Gupta I* of the Gupta dynasty. Situated in Bihar, about 90 km southeast of Patna and 16 km from Rajgir, it grew into the world's first great residential university. Spreading over nearly **23 hectares**, the campus had rows of red-brick monasteries, lecture halls, temples, stupas, and the magnificent multi-storeyed library *Dharmaosthanja*. At its peak, more than 10,000 students and around 2,000 teachers lived and studied here, making it a vibrant city of learning that attracted scholars from across Asia.

For almost 700 years, Nalanda thrived under the patronage of rulers such as *Harshavardhana* and the Pala

kings. The curriculum was rich and diverse, while Buddhist philosophy was its core; students also studied grammar, medicine, logic, astronomy, mathematics, and Vedic texts. The accounts of Chinese scholars *Xuanzang* and *Yijing* describe Nalanda as one of the greatest centers of knowledge in the ancient world. Unfortunately, in 1193 CE, the Turkic invader *Bakhtiyar Khilji* set the university ablaze, destroying its invaluable libraries and ending its glorious journey.

The ruins of Nalanda, rediscovered in the 19th century, still echo its greatness. In the modern era, India revived this legacy through the *Nalanda University Act, 2010*, with support from several *East Asian Summit (EAS) countries*, rebuilding it as an international university at Rajgir. Its recognition as a *UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2016* further cemented its global importance. Nalanda remains not just a chapter of the past but a timeless symbol of India's

intellectual strength, reminding us that while structures may fall, the flame of knowledge can always be rekindled.

Chittorgarh Fort

Chittorgarh Fort stands as one of the grandest and most significant forts in Indian history. Known for its architectural brilliance, tales of valor, and deep cultural heritage, the fort is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a proud symbol of Rajputana glory.

It was built in the 7th century by the Mauryan rulers. Over centuries, it became the stronghold of the Sisodia Rajputs of Mewar. The fort has witnessed countless battles, including the famous sieges by Alauddin Khilji in 1303, Bahadur Shah of Gujarat in 1535, and the Mughal Emperor Akbar in 1567. Despite repeated attacks, the fort remained a center of Rajput courage, sacrifice, and resistance against foreign invasions.

Chittorgarh is not just a fort of stones, it is a fort of sacrifice and bravery. The Rajput defenders fought fearlessly, but when defeat seemed inevitable, the women of Chittor committed Jauhar (self-immolation) to preserve their honor. Three major Jauhars were recorded here—led by Rani Padmini, Rani Karnavati, and others—making the fort a symbol of Rajput pride and valor.

Spread over an area of nearly 700 acres, the fort rises 180 meters above the surrounding plains. It is one of the largest forts in India, with seven massive gateways (pols) such as Padan Pol, Ganesh Pol, and Hanuman Pol. Inside, the fort houses palaces, temples, reservoirs, and towers, each narrating stories of the past. It reflects the soul of Rajasthan, where honor was valued above life itself. As the sun sets behind its ancient walls, the fort continues to whisper stories of glory, inspiring generations to remember the timeless legacy of Rajput valor.

Mars is named by the ancient Romans for their god of war because its reddish color was reminiscent of blood. The Egyptians called it "Her Desher," meaning "the red one." It is called the "Red Planet" because iron minerals in the Martian dirt oxidize, or rust, causing the surface to look red.

As Mars orbits the Sun, it completes one rotation every 24.6 hours, which is similar to one day on Earth (23.9 hours). Martian days are called sols – ("solar day.") A year on Mars lasts 669.6 sols, which is the same as 687 Earth days.

Mars' axis of rotation is tilted 25°, which is very close to Earth's axial tilt of 23.4°. Like Earth, Mars has distinct seasons, but they last longer than seasons here on Earth since Mars takes longer to orbit the Sun. And while here on Earth the seasons are evenly spread over the year, lasting 3 months (or one quarter of a year), on Mars the seasons vary in length because of Mars' elliptical, egg-shaped orbit around the Sun.

Mars has two small moons, Phobos and Deimos, that may be captured asteroids. They're potato-shaped because they have too little mass for gravity to make them spherical. The moons get their names from the horses that pulled the chariot of the Greek god of war, Ares. Phobos, the innermost and larger moon, is heavily cratered, with deep grooves on its surface. It is slowly moving towards Mars and will crash into the planet or break apart in about 50 million years. Deimos is about half as big as Phobos and orbits two and a half times farther away from Mars. Oddly-shaped Deimos is covered in loose dirt that often fills the craters on its surface, making it appear smoother than pockmarked Phobos. At the surface, we find colors brown, gold, and tan. The Mars looks reddish is due to oxidization – or rusting – of iron in the rocks, regolith, and dust of Mars. Due to this dust present in the atmosphere and from a distance makes the planet appear mostly red.

Mars appears to have had a watery past, with ancient river valley networks, deltas, and lakebeds, as well as rocks and minerals on the surface that could only have formed in liquid water. There is water on Mars today, but the Martian atmosphere is too thin for liquid water to exist for long on the surface. Today, water on Mars is found in the form of water-ice just under the surface in the polar regions as well as in briny (salty) water, which seasonally flows down some hillsides and crater walls.

Mars has a thin atmosphere made up mostly of Carbon dioxide, Nitrogen, and Argon gases. The temperature on Mars can be as high as 20°C or as low as (-153°C). And because the atmosphere is so thin, heat from the Sun easily escapes this planet. If you were to stand on the surface of Mars on the equator at noon, it would feel like spring at your feet 24°C and winter at your head 0°C.

Occasionally, winds on Mars are strong enough to create dust storms that cover much of the planet, and takes months before all of the dust settles. (Source:- NASA)

Among all the planets in our Solar System, Venus shines the brightest. The Planet Venus is named after the Roman goddess of love and beauty, and is the only planet, named after a female deity. Although similar in size and structure, Venus is a world of burning heat, thick clouds, and deadly gases. It is the second planet from the Sun and the hottest planet of all. Scientists once believed that Venus might be a sister planet to Earth. But when space probes studied it more closely, they discovered a harsh and deadly environment unlike anything on our planet. A year on Venus lasts about 225 Earth days, while one day on Venus - its rotation period - takes about 243 Earth days. This means that a day on Venus is longer than its year! Interestingly, Venus spins in the opposite direction of most planets, so the Sun rises in the West and sets in the East - the reverse of what we see on Earth. The atmosphere of Venus is made up of thick clouds of carbon dioxide and sulfuric acid, which trap the Sun's heat and create a runaway greenhouse effect. As a result, the average surface temperature is about 465°C - hot enough to melt lead. The air pressure on the surface is 92 times greater than Earth's, which is equal to being nearly one kilometer under the ocean. Through radar mapping by NASA's Magellan spacecraft, scientists discovered that Venus is covered with mountains, plains, and volcanoes. Many of these volcanoes are huge, and some may still be active today.

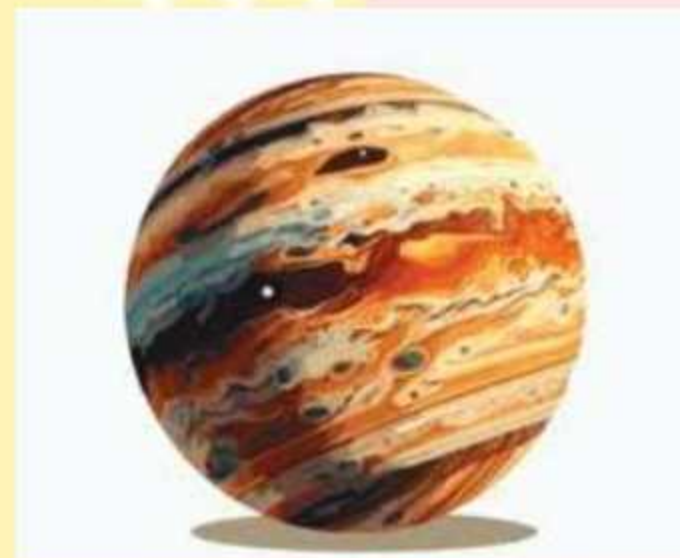
Despite its beauty from space, the surface of Venus is one of the most extreme places in the Solar System. It stands alone, glowing brightly in our sky as the Morning Star and the Evening Star. Though similar in size to Earth, its thick carbon dioxide atmosphere has trapped so much heat that it became a dry and toxic world. Scientists believe that Venus might have once had oceans, but they evaporated long ago as the planet heated up. Venus has been explored by several missions over the years. NASA's Mariner and Magellan spacecraft provided valuable data about its atmosphere and surface, while the Soviet Venera landers were the first to touch down on the planet. Japan's Akatsuki mission is currently studying its weather and clouds, and NASA is preparing two new missions - DA VINCI+ and VERITAS - to uncover even more of Venus's secrets. Venus is a planet of both beauty and mystery. Its golden clouds hide a burning world of fire and storms, reminding us how different planets can be even when they start out alike. By studying Venus, NASA scientists hope to learn how planets change over time - and how Earth can avoid the same fate. Venus reminds us that not every world that shines bright is safe - some burn brighter than the Sun itself. (Source:- NASA)

JUPITER is the largest planet in our Solar System and the fifth one from the Sun. It's so big that more than 1,300 Earths could fit inside it! It doesn't have a solid surface like Earth. Despite being so far from the Sun, Jupiter shines brightly in the night sky due to its enormous size and thick atmosphere. It takes about 12 Earth years to complete one orbit around the Sun, but a day on Jupiter is very short - it rotates once every 10 hours. This rapid spin causes its clouds to form colorful bands across the planet, creating the famous striped appearance we see in telescope images. One of the most striking features of Jupiter is the Great Red Spot - a gigantic storm that has been raging for centuries. Jupiter's atmosphere is made mostly of hydrogen and helium, with swirling clouds of ammonia and water vapor, giving it a unique and beautiful look. Jupiter has an incredibly strong magnetic field - about 20,000 times stronger than Earth's. The planet's gravity is so strong that it helps protect the inner planets, including Earth, by pulling in comets and asteroids that might otherwise hit us. Another amazing fact about Jupiter is its moons. It has more than 90 known moons! The four largest ones - Io, Europa, Ganymede, and Callisto - are known as the Galilean moons, discovered by Galileo Galilei in 1610. Each of these moons is unique: Io has active volcanoes, Europa may have an ocean beneath its icy surface, Ganymede is the largest moon in the Solar System, and Callisto is covered with craters. Jupiter has been studied by several NASA missions, including Pioneer, Voyager, Galileo, and Juno. The Juno spacecraft, which arrived at Jupiter in 2016, continues to study its atmosphere, magnetic field, and deep interior. Jupiter acts as the protector of our Solar System, using its massive gravity to shape the orbits of other planets and prevent dangerous space rocks from entering the inner Solar System. Jupiter is not just a giant - it is a natural shield, a scientific wonder, and a breathtaking example of the power and beauty of our universe. It reminds us that even in the cold depths of space, there are worlds of mystery and motion waiting to be explored. Saturn is the sixth planet from the Sun and the second largest planet in our solar system. It is well known for its beautiful and bright rings that surround the planet make it look more attractive. Saturn is a gas giant, which means it is mostly made up of gases such as hydrogen and helium. Unlike Earth, Saturn does not have a solid surface, so if someone tried to land on it, they would just sink into its thick atmosphere. Saturn's size is too big, which is almost 9.5 times wider than Earth. Because Saturn spins very quickly, causes it to be flattened at the poles, making its shape look like a squished ball. One of the most amazing things about Saturn is its ring system. The rings are made of billions of tiny pieces of ice and rock, ranging from tiny dust-sized pieces to large sized pieces as big as houses or mountains. These rings stretch around Saturn for about 270,000 kilometers but are very thin, only about 10 meters thick in some parts. The rings reflect sunlight, which makes them shine and look very bright when we look through telescopes.

Saturn's atmosphere is thick and filled with clouds made mostly of ammonia crystals and water ice. Winds can blow extremely fast on Saturn, reaching speeds of over 1,800 kilometers per hour. At the north pole of Saturn, there is a strange six-sided jet stream shaped like a hexagon, which is a unique weather pattern not found anywhere else in the solar system. Saturn also has a huge family of moon- it has approximately 274 of moons ! Its biggest moon is Titan, which is larger than the planet Mercury and has its own thick atmosphere made mostly of nitrogen and methane. Some other moons, like Enceladus, may have oceans under their icy surfaces, which makes them interesting places for scientists searching for signs of life. Even though Saturn is very big, it is not very dense. Its average density is less than water. Saturn takes almost 30 Earth years to complete one orbit around the Sun, making its year very long. It also gives off more heat than it receives from the Sun because it has a hot interior that produces energy. Saturn is a fascinating planet full of wonders, with its enormous size, beautiful rings, many moons, and fast storms making it an exciting world to explore and learn about in our solar system.(Source:-NASA)

The Earth is the third planet from the Sun and is known to harbor life. Almost all of Earth's water is contained in its global ocean, covering 70.8% of the Earth Crust. The remaining 29.2% of Earth's crust is land, which consists of slowly moving tectonic plates, which interact to produce mountain ranges, volcanoes, and earthquakes.

Water vapor is widely present in the atmosphere, forming clouds that cover most of the planet. The average surface temperature of 14.76°C , Earth is rounded into an ellipsoid with a circumference of about 40,000km. and orbits it, taking a year (about 365.25 days) to complete one revolution. The Earth rotates around its own axis in about 23 hours and 56 minutes. The Earth is orbited by one permanent natural satellite, the Moon.

Earth diameter is 12,742 km. and has the shape of an ellipsoid, bulging at its equator; its diameter is 43 km longer there than at its poles. The world ocean is divided into the Pacific Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Indian Ocean, Southern Ocean, and Arctic Ocean, from largest to smallest.

Earth's mass is approximately 5.97×10^{24} kg. It is composed mostly of iron (32.1% by mass), oxygen (30.1%), silicon (15.1%), magnesium (13.9%), sulfur (2.9%), nickel (1.8%), calcium (1.5%), and aluminum (1.4%), with the remaining 1.2% consisting of trace amounts of other elements. Due to gravitational separation, the core is primarily composed of the denser elements: iron (88.8%), with smaller amounts of nickel (5.8%), sulfur (4.5%), and less than 1% trace elements. The crust is composed of various oxides of eleven elements, principally oxides containing silicon (the silicate minerals), aluminum, iron, calcium, magnesium, potassium, or sodium.

Earth's rotation period relative to the fixed stars, called its stellar day by the International Earth Rotation and Reference Systems Service (IERS), is 86,164.0989 seconds of mean solar time (UT1), or 23h 56m 4.0989s. The orbital speed of Earth averages at 29.7827 km/s (107,218 km/h; 66,622 mph).

The axial tilt of Earth is approximately 23.439281° The atmospheric pressure at Earth's sea level averages 101.325 kPa (14.696 psi), The height of the troposphere varies with latitude, ranging between 8 km (5 mi) at the poles to 17 km (11 mi) at the equator, with some variation resulting from weather and seasonal factors. 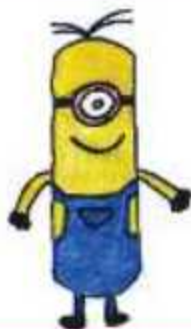
सेठ हुकुमचंद

सेठ हुकुमचंद का पूरा नाम सेठ हुकुमचंद जैन था। वह गणितज्ञ, समाजसेवी और जैन समुदाय के प्रेरक नेताओं में से एक थे। उन्हें लोग भारत के कपास राजा के नाम से भी जानते थे। उनका जन्म 14 जुलाई 1874 के इंदौर (मध्य प्रदेश) में हुआ था। उनके पूर्वज सेठ पूसाजी 1787 में इंदौर में बसे थे और हिल्कर राज्य के संरक्षण में कारोबार किया करते थे। उनके पिता जी सेठ सरूप चंद एक सफल व्यापारी थे। बचपन से ही वह अपने परिवार के व्यवसाय में जुड़े थे। 16 वर्ष की आयु तक उन्होंने खुद से भी सफल व्यवसाय शुरू कर दिया था। उन्होंने बुनियाद तौर पर व्यापार में कपास, जूट, लोहा - धातु, अनाज, सोना-चांदी जैसे विभिन्न वाणिज्यिक वस्तुओं में सक्रियता दिखाएं। इंदौर अपने जन्म स्थल पर उन्होंने "हुकुमचंद मिल", "राजकुमार मिल" जैसे कपास मिल स्थापित की। उन्होंने स्वदेशी आंदोलन और खादी आंदोलन में सक्रिय भूमिका निभाई - उन्होंने विदेशी वस्तुओं में व्यापार करने के लिए मना कर भारत निर्मित वस्तुओं को प्रयोग में लेने के लिए प्रोत्साहित किया। उनकी सामाजिक प्रतिष्ठा इतनी थी कि उनके निधन पर विदेशों में भी ध्यान गया - उदाहरण के लिए न्यूयॉर्क कॉटन एक्सचेंज में उनके निधन पर दो दिन बंद रहने की खबर मिली। उन्होंने अपने व्यवसाय के साथ-साथ धार्मिक कार्य करने में भी अपनी भूमिका निभाई। जैसे कि उन्होंने इंदौर में प्रसिद्ध कांच मंदिर का निर्माण करवाया। उन्होंने शिक्षा, चिकित्सा एवं सामाजिक कल्याण कार्यों में भारी दान सहायता दी। 1915 में उन्हें अपने कार्यों के लिए सम्मानित भी किया गया। 1915 में उन्हें "राय बहादुर" का खिताब मिला, इंदौर एवं मध्य प्रदेश के समाज कार्य क्षेत्र में उनकी विरासत आज भी प्रभावशाली है। उनके नाम से अनेक संस्था-संस्थान कार्यरत हैं। सेठ हुकुमचंद का जीवन हमें यह संदेश देता है कि व्यवसायिक सफलता केवल व्यक्तिगत लाभ के लिए नहीं है बल्कि समाज-सेवा धर्म-निष्ठा और देश हित में भी उपयोग हो सकती है। उन्होंने उद्योग में नवाचार और सामाजिक क्षेत्र में उदारता के जो दर्शन प्रस्तुत किए वह आज भी प्रेरणास्त्रोत हैं।
