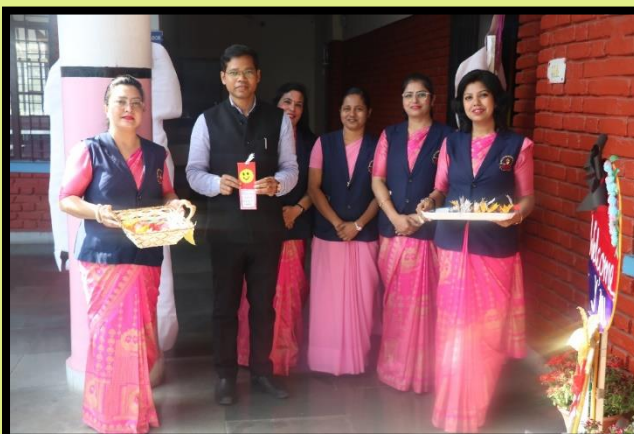

RHYME TIME COMPETITION

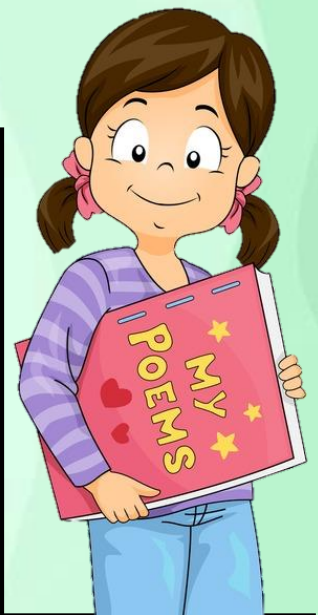
(10th July, 2025)

(8th September, 2025)



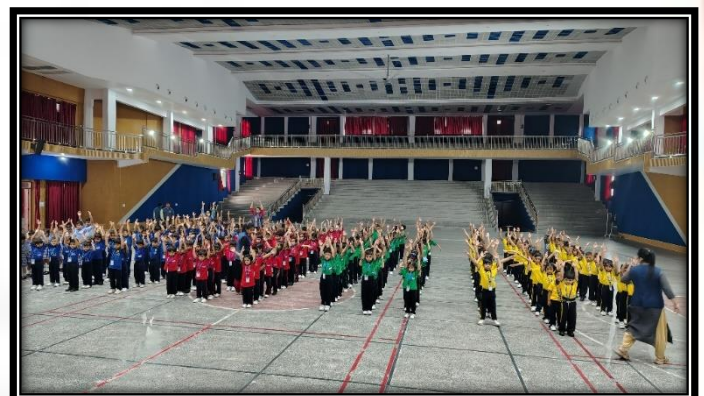

The event concluded on a cheerful note, leaving behind memories of joy, unity, and youthful spirit.

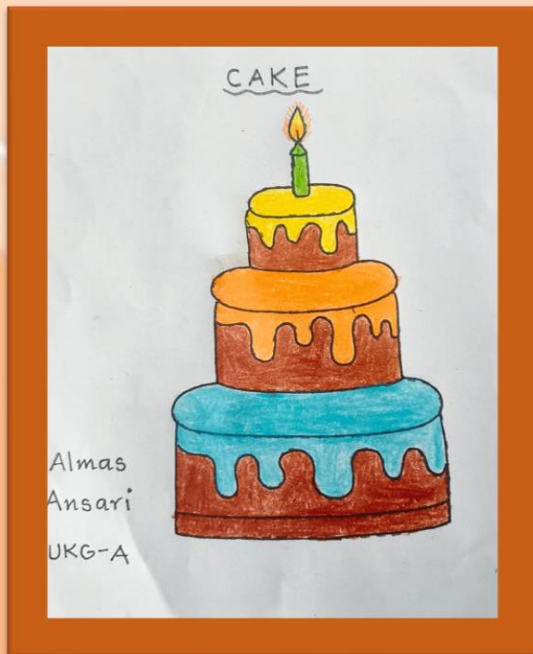




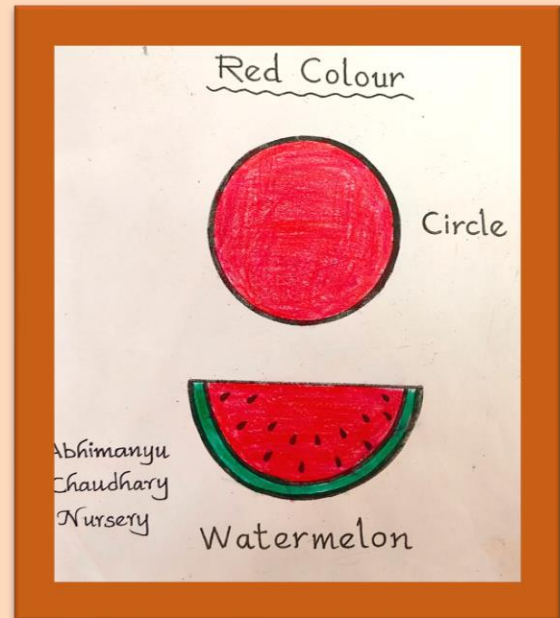
