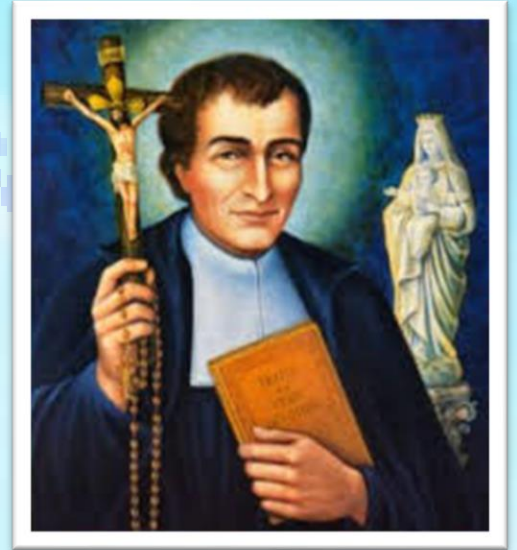

# OUR VISION, OUR MISSION

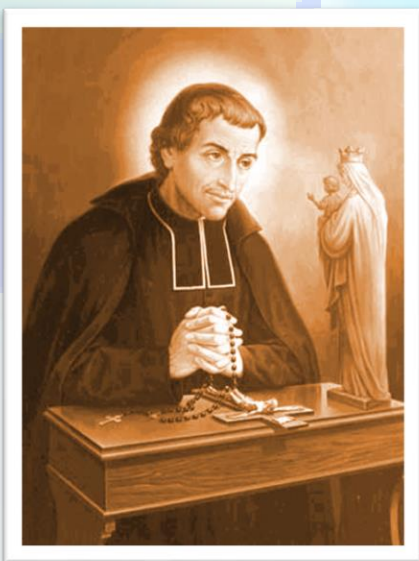
## OUR VISION

# ***STRESS MANAGEMENT SEMINAR***



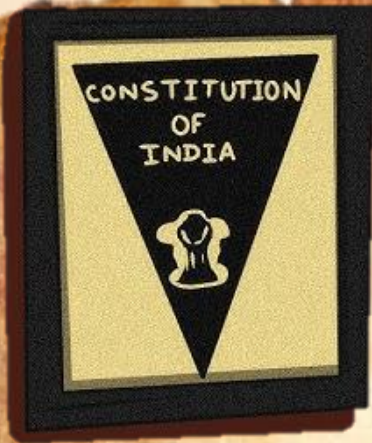

# FLAMELESS COOKING ACTIVITY

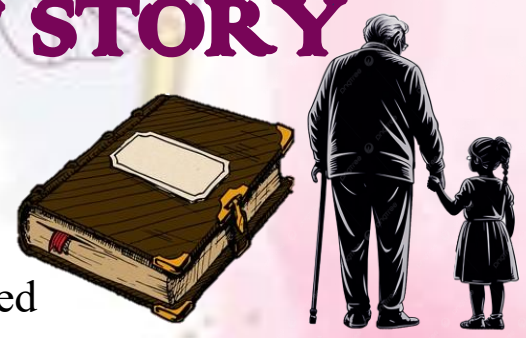
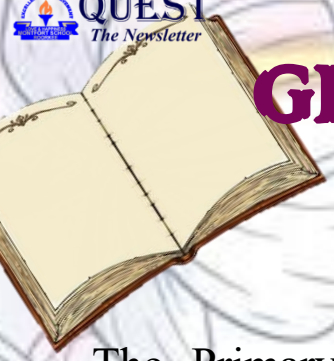
To encourage creativity and to promote healthy food habits, a Flameless Cooking Activity was organised for the students of **Classes I to V** on **February 20, 2026**.

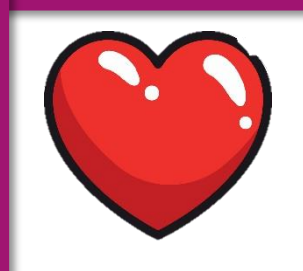
Teachers guided and supported the students throughout the activity. The event helped children learn teamwork, coordination, and presentation skills while enjoying the process.

# INTERSCHOOL BADMINTON TOURNAMENT

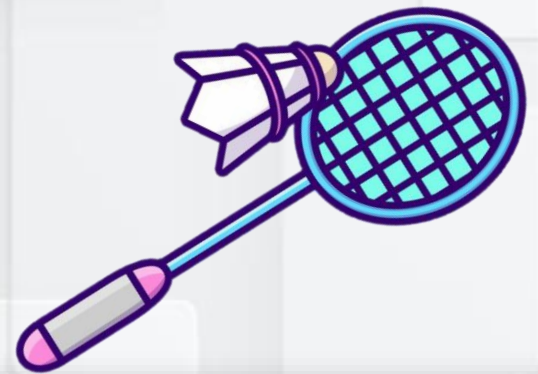

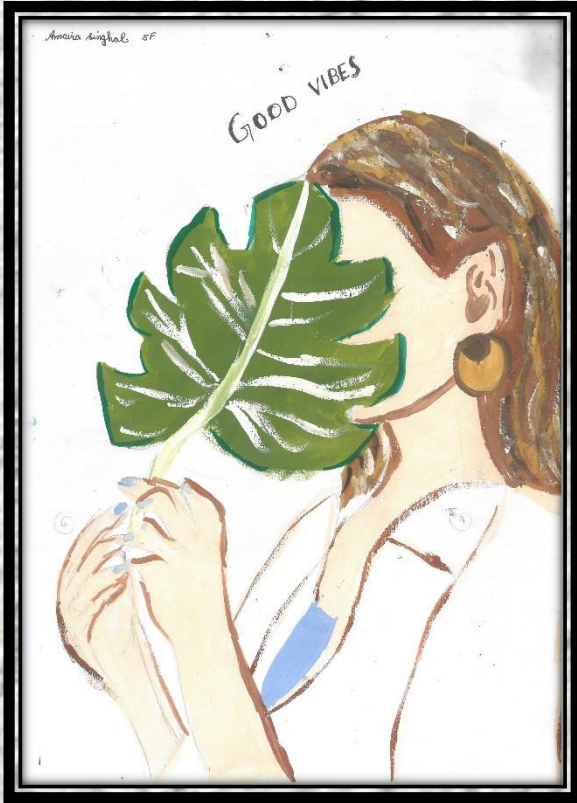
In the Boys Under-11 category, Daksh Goel of Class V-G secured the First Position, while Manas Kukreja of Class V-G secured the Second Position.
