Make him/her just do two activities in a day.


Click pictures of your child doing the activities and make a collage.

- Adopting a plant and watering it everyday.

Gross Motor Skills

- Running
- Jogging

- Climbing up and down the stairs

- Sliding


Fine Motor Skills

- Colouring within the boundary
- Tearing/pasting the paper
- Stringing beads
- Sorting activities
- Lacing
- Dough/clay moulding
- Digging the soil/sand play
- Cutting the paper with a pair of child friendly scissor

Fun with Patterns



- Take A4 size sheets and draw different patterns as shown in the picture.
- Let the child place the bottle caps on the circles and ice cream sticks on the lines to complete the pattern.



- Take two A-4 size sheets.
- Draw any pattern on them as shown in the picture.
- Let the child roll two balls simultaneously on both the patterns.

Focus and Balance



- Take 8 objects of same height such as glasses, cups, boxes etc.
- Place them in two rows side by side to make 4 pairs.
- Place 1 ice-cream stick on each pair, as shown in the picture.
- Let the child lift an ice cream stick using 1 finger and place it on the next pair.
- Continue till all the ice-cream sticks are collected on the last pair.

Brain Teaser





- Take an A4 size sheet. Use an open ended shape in all four directions to make a pattern, with different coloured circle in each shape.
- Draw more patterns on the sheet changing the direction of the shapes in every line.
- Give 4 bottle caps/ circle cutouts of the corresponding colours to the child and let him/her place the caps according the direction of the shape in the pattern.

Dancing Spaghetti



Material Required

- A glass of water
- Vermicelli/ Spaghetti
- A pinch of baking soda
- Lemon juice



- 1. Take a glass of water
- 2. Put some Vermicelli/ Spaghetti in it.
- 3. Add a pinch of baking soda and lemon juice.

Watch the spaghetti dancing in the glass!

Material Required


- A zip-lock bag

- Water




- 1. Help your child to draw a rainbow using different coloured markers on a paper .

Watch the colors vanish like magic!
















- Festivals





The Mighty Elephant

Material Required

- Mountboard
- Poster colour
- Decorative material like mirror, lace, stones etc.



Procedure

- 1. Take the printout of an elephant of size (8" x 10").
- 2. Paint/colour the elephant.
- 3. Decorate it with mirrors, stones, laces, buttons etc.
- 4. Paste the decorated elephant on the mount board and cut it.



Kites



Material Required

- Thick pastel sheet
- Glitter Sheet
- Decorative material like mirror, lace, stones, tassels etc.



Procedure

- 1. Draw a kite on a bright coloured thick pastel sheet and cut it.
- 2. Paste the pom -pom , lace etc. on the outline of the kite .
- 3. Decorate it with mirrors, stone stickers, tassels etc.
- 4. Cut two circles of glitter sheet and paste them on the kite as shown in the picture .

Tanjore Doll





Procedure

Material Required

- Ivory Sheet
- Circle cut outs
- Decorative material like mirror ,lace , stones , artificial flowers etc.

Did you know?
Tanjore dolls are a symbol of Indian culture often used for navratri celebrations and as souvenirs.

- 1. Take a black and white A 4 size printout of the Tanjore doll.
- 2. Colour the picture.
- 3. Dress the Tanjore dolls with cloth, mirrors, beads, etc.
- 4. Paste the doll on an ivory sheet.
