Motor Skills

Gross Motor Skills

- Running
- Jogging
- Hopping
- Skipping
- Jumping over simple hurdles
- Jumping down from a height of 2 feet
- Climbing up and down the stairs
- Cycling
- Hopping 4-5 steps on one leg

Fine Motor Skills

- Colouring within the boundary
- Painting with a brush
- Paper tearing and pasting
- Cutting paper with a pair of child friendly scissor
- Stringing beads/buttons
- Lacing
- Dough making/clay moulding
- Sorting-Example: sorting rajmah beans and whole gram.

NOTE : Create more of the worksheets like the ones given in the holiday homework and let your ward do them .

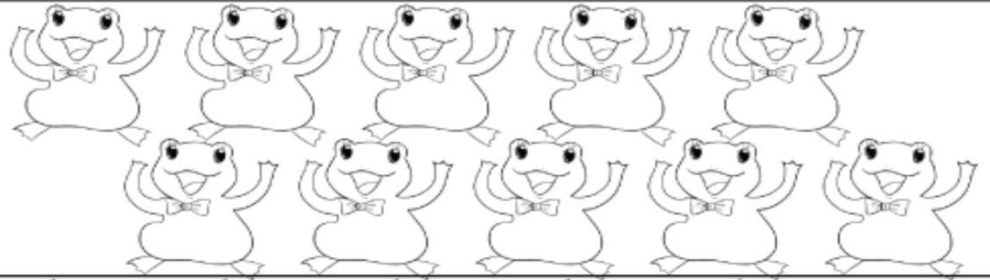

Material Required

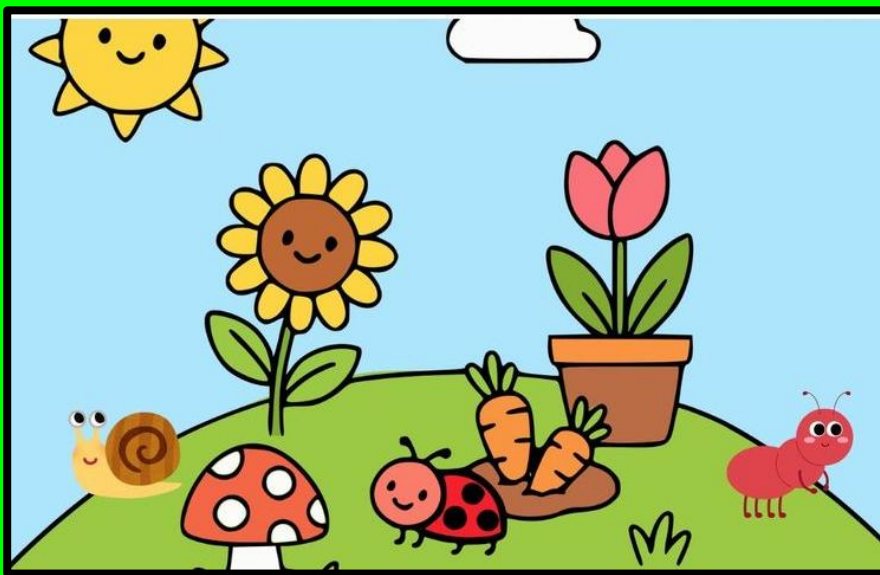
- A piece of jute gunny cloth – 8" X 6"

Procedure:

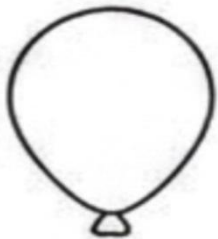
- Take the jute gunny cloth and draw horizontal lines on it.

Flying Rocket



Material Required:

- Two Eco- friendly paper glasses
- 2 rubber bands
- Bright colour pastel sheets (Any colour)
- Decoration Material such as sticker star



Procedure:

- Make 4 holes near the rim of one glass in four different directions.
- String the rubber bands in the holes as shown in the picture.
- Cover the glass with coloured paper. Use bright coloured cutouts to make wings and decorate the glass with sticker stars
- Make a small cone and paste it on top to give it the look of a rocket.
- Place the rocket on the other glass. Press it down on the inner glass, with pressure and then release it with a jerk.
- The rocket will go flying up.

Kathakali Mask Making



Material Required:

- Ivory sheet
- Acrylic Paint/ poster colours
- Decoration Material such as beads, bindis, mirrors etc.

Procedure:

- Take the printout of a kathakali mask/draw the mask on A3 ivory sheet. Colour the image using bright paints.
- Decorate the mask using stone stickers, mirrors and other decoration material.



Coconut Shell Hut



Material Required:

- Thick pastel sheet/a round can
- Half Coconut Shell
- Acrylic Paints
- Ice Cream Sticks

Procedure:

- Take a thick pastel sheet and roll it to make a cylindrical shape. Alternatively, you may take a round can and paint it to make the lower part of the hut. Cut the door and windows out of a glitter sheet and paste it on the can.
- Paste one half of coconut shell on the top of the base.
- Decorate the rooftop using artificial flowers etc.
- Colour the cardboard cutout Use coloured ice cream sticks/stones/lace on the edges to make a boundry wall. Stick the hut on it.

Paper Rangoli



Material Required:

- Full size palm leaf/eco friendly plate
- Colourful, geometrical shape paper cutouts
- Decoration material – mirrors, bindis, stone stickers

Procedure:

- Cut geometrical shapes from bright coloured paste sheets.
- Arrange and paste the shapes on the plate to make a rangoli pattern.
- Use decoration material of your choosing to decorate your rangoli.

Boat Craft



Material Required:

1. Corrugated Sheet
2. Fevistick

Procedure:

1. Take a corrugated sheet and make the base of the boat as shown in the picture (length 15 inches X width 8 inches)
2. Take a piece of corrugated sheet and fix it in the center, from one side of the boat to the other side, to make a cabin.
3. Cut the windows from the cabin wall.
4. Decorate the boat using material of your choice.

Umbrella Making



Material Required:

1. One basket/large size plastic bowl (approx. diameter 12 inches)
2. Plain bright colour cloth to cover the outer circumference of the basket.
3. Thick golden lace, mirrors and tassels for decoration.
4. Wooden stick to make rod of the umbrella.

Procedure

1. Take a basket and cover it with a bright coloured cloth .
2. Paste a golden lace around circumference of basket
3. Decorate the basket with mirrors and tassels.
4. Cover the stick with a golden ribbon/lace.
5. Fix the rod under the basket to make the handle of the umbrella
