Commonwealth Games, does it really represent true spirit of games?

Having a historical colonial past experienced by India, the relevance of commonwealth games in today's context has always been a topic of debates & controversies. While, in last few years India has come up as a shining country, recent dropping of shooting game from the list of participating sports has really opened up a pandora's box.

Athlete Manu Bhaker said earlier this year that it looked like they were being taken for granted. Though she was talking this in the context of non-inclusion of shooting but actually it was not mere a statement rather she might have been making a larger historical point. Our country's hockey federation also insisted upon a plaintive tone in their letter to the CWG about their threatening for boycotting the event last year.

The letter from Hockey federation of India entailed that such discriminatory restrictions were not imposed on Indian athletes and officials during the recent Tokyo Olympic Games. The CWG may be the third-largest multi-sporting extravaganza in the world, covering athletes across a population of 2.5 billion people, a third of the global population, but the geographical ambit of the event has always been in flux.

India had been an important part of participating countries who had boycotted the 1986 CWG against Margaret Thatcher's United Kingdom's refusal to cut sporting ties with apartheid South Africa. It was evident that then games had looked like a whites-only one as a result, perhaps reflecting how they had originally been envisioned - white rulers using sports as a tool to keep their dominions under check.

This year India has totalled a stellar show by her athletes, who saw them amass a tally of 22 gold medals, and over-all 61 medals during the recently concluded Commonwealth Games 2022 in Birmingham. Though India finished fourth in the CWG 2022 medal tally, behind Australia, England and Canada, it is high time for India & other participating historical colonies of UK to rethink about taking this game further.

The 'Black Lives Matter' movement has served as a catalyst in a rising wave of anti-colonial sentiment across the world in the last couple of years.

Indian Olympic Association (IOA) president Narinder Batra in 2019 advocated that India should withdraw from the CWG because not only the level of competition is low but also the realm continues to mistreat India, the association's largest member in terms of population. "Yet, they don't consider India seriously. There are 13 committees and there isn't one Indian in them. There is no Indian on the executive board.

Hence, as a matter of fact, it is in the wider interest of India to shed its colonial past & shine through true colours of freedom and that will be one of the best ways to celebrate, "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav". India should start its own games of south east Asian countries like it did for cricket as IPL.
