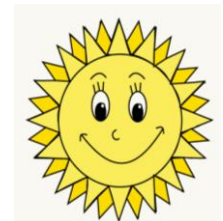


ACTIVITY 2 - "Little Feet, Big Discoveries"

- **Presentation:** Speak 2-3 simple lines about your drawings in class.



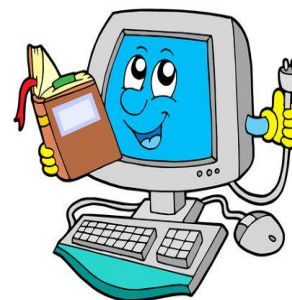

Decorate it with colours, stickers, ribbons, or your own drawings to make it attractive.
